

Spectators are not permitted in the spontaneous problem room. Creativity and "thinking on our feet" are key components of the Odyssey program. All teams in the same division of the same Long-Term problem receive the same Spontaneous problem. Spontaneous problems must remain closely guarded secrets, known only to the participating team members until all team members have competed!

#### ODYSSEY OF THE MIND

Odyssey of the Mind (OM<sup>TM</sup>) teaches students how to develop and use their natural creativity to become problem-solvers. Imagine being faced with a problem that requires an original solution. It can be frightening. Now imagine not being afraid to solve that problem – that is what OM members learn. This skill and self-confidence will carry over to all areas of their lives. OM brings the classroom to life as students apply what they learn and combine it with their interests and passions to solve our unique openended problems. OM also emphasizes teamwork, budgeting, time management, public speaking, and so much more. This international program is designed to help students at all learning levels grow as individual learners, grow as team members, and to reach their full potential.

#### **OMER AWARD**

The OMER's award is not intended to reward creativity, instead it is designed to recognize individuals or teams who exemplify the philosophy and spirit of Odyssey of the Mind. Criteria include exceptional talent, outstanding sportsmanship, and superior teamwork. Recipients of this award may nominate a candidate for this award, however, a team of tournament officials makes the final determination if the nominees recieve this honor.

#### RENATRA FUSCA CREATIVITY AWARD

The Renatra Fusca Creativity Award represents the essence of Odyssey of the Mind. It is presented by the judging team to a team or individuals who exhibit exceptional creativity. Success in solving the Long-Term problem is not a criterion for winning this award. This is designed to encourage risk taking in solving problems. This is the highest award presented in Odyssey of the Mind.


#### **ABOUT US**


